a message from our board chairman

We are so blessed at Hospice Care of the Lowcountry to have compassionate staff, committed volunteers and skilled board members. We all stand on the shoulders of volunteers and staff who dedicated themselves over the last 36 years to end-of-life patients and their families. The board is working hard to build on that legacy to further enhance our services and support to the community.

As Board chair, I plan to keep the community abreast of regulatory changes that can effect Hospice Care of the Lowcountry, and you. Please read the article about the proposed 2% cut to the Medicare hospice benefit. This will increase the gap in the actual cost of care and services we provide and the payments received, creating an additional loss of at least \$50,000 to HCL in 2020. Patient care is our priority, we will increase our fundraising and appeal efforts accordingly. Quality end of life care is our bottom line.

As MedPAC has recommended a zero percent update to the hospice payment rates since 2014, for many providers in the hospice community, MedPAC's current proposal to reduce the fiscal year 2020 Medicare payment rate by two percent is the issue that stands out in the March report.

Hospice care by the numbers

will provide a flag, box, pin and certificate to honor a Veteran patient.



\$250

will provide veterinary care, medications, grooming and exercise to help a hospice patient keep their beloved pet.



\$500

will provide ongoing Bereavement support for a youth who has lost a parent or sibling. HCL offers many support services that are open to the community.



\$1,000

will provide a week of an overnight private duty home health aide to allow the family caregiver some much needed rest.



\$5,000

will provide some monthly expenses for those community members on hospice who are underinsured or have no insurance and may not be eligible for Medicare or Medicaid.
